THE SAQ

One of the required elements on AP History exams, as well as your exams this year, is the SAQ (Short Answer Question.) These questions require students to use historical thinking skills to respond to a primary source, an historians' argument, non-textual sources such as data or maps, or general propositions about world history. Each SAQ asks students to demonstrate a different historical thinking skill in the process of identifying and analyzing examples of historical evidence relevant to the source or question. Students should be able to answer each part of the SAQ in 3-5 sentences. (The ability to be concise is key...on your final and the AP test you will have a designated amount of space to answer the question!)
